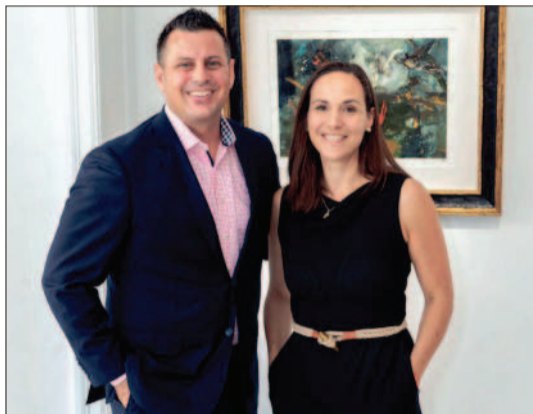

Norton Museum to host Family Autism Art Workshop

The Norton Museum of Art embraces accessibility. Nowhere is that more apparent than with the programming by the Museum's Learning & Community Engagement Department.

As an activity to mark World Autism Month, on Sunday, April 14, the Museum will offer a Family Autism Art Workshop.

The free program will include an art-making workshop featuring the technique of assemblage, inspired by the artist Deborah Willis.

"All participating staff members are trained to lead programs for people with autism, ensuring activities will be fun and accessible to guests of all skill levels," said Meredith Gregory, Director of School and Teacher Programs. "Students and parents will be inspired by instructor Manuela Gonzalez' direction. It's one of many programs we offer throughout the year to engage people on the autism spectrum and their families."

Manuela Gonzalez is an artist and educator with a background in painting and textile work. She holds a BFA from Rhode Island School of Design and an MFA in painting from the Yale University School of Art. Manuela has led accessibility programming in Spanish and English at several museums and art institutions since 2007 both in New York City and West Palm Beach.

As a museum educator, she has worked with access, teen and school programs at El Museo del Barrio, The Whitney Museum, The Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum and the Museum of Modern Art, drawing from her personal studio experience to develop programming that connects the process, materials and history of the artworks she references in a way that is inclusive and multimodal.

Among the things participating families will receive are the following:

- Taking an interactive walk through the contemporary art exhibition galleries.
- Making art inspired by the artist Deborah Willis with arts educator Manuela Gonzalez.

Cancer Alliance of Help & Hope (CAHH) hosted one of the most exciting luncheons of the season on Feb. 7 at The Breakers Palm Beach. The nonprofit's 2024 Shop The Day Away Luncheon featured keynote speaker Sarah Ferguson, Duchess of York.

Arlette Gordon, Joseph McNamara and Max McNamara served as chairs of the luncheon. Jacqui Michel, Laura Moore Tanne, and Michelle Worth were honorary chairs.

Ferguson is an author, businesswoman, cancer survivor, and philanthropist who has raised millions of dollars for charities around the world. She is also a leading voice on the importance of early cancer detection and regular mammogram screenings.

Acknowledging her own recent malignant melanoma diagnosis—following a battle with breast cancer—as well as the recent diagnosis of her brother-in-law, King Charles III, with prostate cancer, the duchess said: "I want to thank you all for your kindness in supporting my family members who are going through a hard time, and we wish everyone well, every family in the world, that has been diagnosed or who is going through a difficult time we wish them well."

The duchess credited her daughters Princess Beatrice and Princess Eugenie as being her strength during this challenging time.

She also shared in her speech a breakthrough for change in prostate cancer and neuroendocrine tumors, Lutetium 177, and treating melanoma with Rhenium-SCT. The duchess talked about how biotechnology entrepreneur Sir Chris Evans credits Lutetium 177 with saving Duran Duran guitarist Andy Taylor's life.

CAHH CEO Stanton Collemer expressed his gratitude for the duchess's willingness to share some of the intimate moments of her life during the 2024 Shop The Day Away Luncheon.

"It was truly inspiring to have the Duchess of York speak at our largest fundraising event, which raised more than \$1 million dollars for local families battling cancer," said Collemer. "Her kindness, humor, and graciousness left a lasting impression on everyone present in the room. With every word she spoke, sincerity flowed, touching each heart with a sprinkle of magic."

All proceeds from the luncheon support CAHH's mission of assisting local children, adults, and families affected by cancer and helping with subsequent bills they acquire during the treatment and recovery process. For more information, visit CAHH.org.
